All of school's community is involved in art exhibition

An exhibition of art and design work by the pupils of Dunhurst School (the junior school at Bedales in Steep) will run at Bedales Gallery until March 26.

Dunhurst's biennial exhibition reflects the school as a community.

It aims to mirror the range of experiences offered to pupils, from working alongside visiting artists, such as Frank Jennings, Alex Jones and the school's own artist in residence, Rupert Bathurst, to a community art project, the 'Big Draw', where Dunhurst offered their portrait drawing project as a registered event for the National Campaign for Drawing.

Among the portraits created by cleaning and kitchen staff, teachers and pupils, there is also a wide variety of the pupils' design work, including fashion wear, musical instruments and furniture.

All exhibitions at Bedales Gallery are open Monday to Friday, 2-5pm, Sat-

urday 10am-1pm.

The gallery will be closed on Saturday March 19.

Admission to the exhibition is free.

The programme includes the *Mozart Flute Concerto No 2* (soloist Josie Bentley), Vivaldi's *Concerto in D minor for Two Violins* (soloists Katrina Duncan and Lottie Gulliver), the Concert Band performing 'By the Beautiful Blue Danube' (Johann Strauss II), the Chamber Orchestra playing Albinoni's *Adagio for Strings*, and choral works including Schubert's setting of Psalm 23.
