The younger players then took over with Theo Truss claiming 2 for 42 with his well flighted and deceptive leg breaks and Oscar Amis bowling superbly accurate left-arm off spin at the end. Overall, this was the Gentlemen's best fielding performance of the season so far with all 11 players making a great effort. Max Chancellor pulled a hamstring while fielding in the deep and we wish him a full and speedy recovery. The Hammer Bottoms finished on 197 for 9 and the game ended in a well matched draw.

A final word on our ever-youthful wicket-keeper, Murray Chancellor, who performed sterling work behind the stumps, diving to left and right to keep the runs down. Being a wicket keeper is the hardest fielding position on the field and Murray deserves much praise for his effort and execution.
