## COMPUTER SCIENCE WORKSHOP



Dunhurst students in G2A were the first lucky group to be invited for a new collaboration with Bedales. Over the next 5 weeks Group 2 and Group 3 classes will be spending a large part of their Wednesday morning working at Bedales trialling their new 'Digital Schoolhouse' programme of study. It involves looking at what makes games (both digital and traditional) fun, and distilling that into the creation of something new. Excited students got to experiment with the Nintendo 'Labo' equipment to understand how new games can be designed and explore how computing doesn't always begin with computers. They ended by coming up with their own concepts and designing very rough prototypes for a new game which they presented to each other.

It was a really exciting and interesting morning and we're looking forward to the rest of groups 2 and 3 going up over the next few weeks.




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# Block 1's visit to Beowulf at the Olivier Theatre

### Is there just one story? And do they all end with a dragon?

Seth Kriebel's re-telling of Beowulf played with the conventions of narrative voice, asking the audience to sit upon the stage with him, in role as friend, story-teller and game player. His adaptation played with the linear nature of a narrative, and much like a Fighting Fantasy novel, asked the audience to map our hero's path through the tale.

Kriebel took on the roles of MC, Instructor, and Historian to contextualise the tale, plus the mixed voices of 3rd person Narrator, 1st person Characters, and the 2nd person Gamer! This complex layering of the story, kept the audience hanging on his every word.

As every good show should, it raised some questions, which you may like to discuss:

- ▶ Are all stories changed in the re-telling, and therefore no-story can ever tell the truth?
- ▶ Do stories have power? What power do stories hold for you? What do you think is a powerful story?
- ▶ What defines a hero?
