# How to access your results:

**ONLINE** – log in to My School Portal via this link <u>Bedales Schools</u> Click on 'About Me' and then 'Exam Results' on the left-hand side. Your results should be available from 8:00am onwards. If you are unable to view the information by 10:00am please contact Bedales Reception on 01730 300100. Results are not available to parents online, as results belong to students.

**FROM RECEPTION** – hard copies of results will be available at Bedales Reception for 6.2s to collect in person between 8:00am-2:00pm. These will not be given to anyone else without a specific request in writing (email is fine) at least 24hrs in advance. Requests to the Assistant to the Deputy Head Academic (jcapon@bedales.org.uk)

**BY PHONE** – only available for 6.2 students who are unable to access results online or collect in person and who need the results for a university place. Marks and grades can be relayed over the phone but will not be given to anyone else without a specific request in writing (email is fine). Please book a phone call with the Assistant to the Deputy Head Academic at least 24hrs in advance (jcapon@bedales.org.uk)

#### Results Day – A Level Students:

You will receive A Level grades in all your subjects. Contact the exams officer immediately if you do not appear to have grades for the correct subjects or if a subject is missing (lleeming@bedales.org.uk). The new exams officer will have access to this email address.

**University Admission** – a team of experienced advisors will be available on A Level results day to advise and help students whose grades do not match their university offers. If a university place is at stake and you think your marks should have been better, you can request a priority review of marking. This costs approximately £60/70 per paper but you will know the outcome within 15 days. However, marks can go down as well as up so you must speak to Chloe and the relevant Head of Department for advice. The deadline for requesting a priority re-mark is midday on Friday 25th August.

### Results Day – GCSE/IGCSE/BAC Students:

If you think there has been a mistake in the marking process, please speak to the relevant Head of Department to seek advice.

IGCSEs and GCSE can be remarked but please note that grades can go down as well as up.



Review of marking is not available for BACs as a rigorous internal and external moderation procedure has already taken place. Results may only be challenged on procedural grounds.

## Who will be available to help?

Hopefully you will be pleased with your results and will have got the grades you need for your next steps.

However, if things have not gone according to plan please come in and talk to someone. There will be many members of staff available on both results days to help you sort things out. The sooner you come and see us, the sooner we can help.
